

Sensitive Film or Video Parental Consent Form

Teachers sometimes use full length feature films, instructional videos, and internet video clips as part of their instructional program. Teachers obtain parental consent when:

- A video or video clip that contains controversial or sensitive subject matter is going to be used as part of any course or subject (i.e. Health, CALM, Religious Studies, Social Studies, English Language Arts, etc); or
- The teacher feels that parents may benefit from knowing what their children are viewing; or
- A feature film's rating suggests that it may be inappropriate for a given age range. Parental consent should be obtained for PG films in K-6, 14A films in K-8, and 18A films in all grades.
