All students currently enrolled in high school or who will be entering grade 10 in Sept. 2017 are eligible.

Chinook's Edge offers summer school in three communities, making it convenient for students to take courses for credit. Summer School is available in Innisfail, Sylvan Lake and Olds. High School students, or those entering grade 10 in September 2017, are able to take courses to upgrade existing marks, complete a required course missing from their timetable, or for personal reasons.

Students work at their own pace, but under the guidance and supervision of teachers who provide assistance when needed. Taking a summer course provides students the opportunity to upgrade their marks in a course they didn't do well in, or it can help reduce their course load in September.

Please ensure your students know about this opportunity, so they can begin next school year ahead of the game!
