Chinook's Edge offers summer school in three communities, making it convenient for students to take courses for credit. Summer School is available in Innisfail, Sylvan Lake and Olds. High School students, or those entering grade 10 in September 2018, are able to take courses to upgrade existing marks, complete a required course missing from their timetable, or for personal reasons.

Students work at their own pace, but under the guidance and supervision of teachers who provide assistance when needed. Taking a summer course provides students the opportunity to upgrade their marks in a course they didn't do well in, or it can help reduce their course load in September.

How does your garden grow? At Penhold Crossing Secondary School, the answer is very well indeed!



Groundbreaking - Students at Penhold Crossing Secondary School rolled up their sleeves to help their Green Teens student club build a new pollinator garden for the school grounds. Making gardens welcoming for insects (including essential pollinators such as native bees, butterflies and other beneficial pollinating insects) makes gardens thrive. As they discussed the dramatic decline in habitat loss, the Penhold Crossing garden became a lesson in healthy ecosystems, as well. The idea for the garden initially came out of the school's Environmental Studies CTS course last semester, and now students work together once or twice each week during flex time. Joelle Horning, Kati Steele and Griffin Westrop have been instrumental Green Teens leaders!



It takes a village to raise a garden - Students designed the pollinator garden at Penhold Crossing, and have had assistance from a full slate of people, including Shop students and teachers, volunteers and their teacher mentor, Carmen Christie-Bill. Students also sold rainbarrels, seeds and plants they grew from seeds at a Red Deer market to raise funds for the project.
